
ADOPTION IN THE TREE By Linda Murphy

- There are many different types of adoption. We covered most common ones and discovered they really are very individual. Kingship, International, Foster, Domestic, Infant, Closed, Open, Agency or Attorney. Many options for gleaning the research path to take.
- There are standards established within most of the software packages and sites like Ancestry.com, to know how to denote the differences between biological and adopted parents and children.
- Most important take-away is to review all the many methods of documenting, find the one that most suits your needs and stay consistent.
- Remember that this is delicate information and not all family members may be-in-the-know. Be respectful and sensitive in gathering details, researching methods and communication involved to keep integrity for the process and all involved.
